Uber

Since Gloucester City Council have licensed the private hire operator Uber, there has been an increase in reports of both Gloucester and South Gloucestershire licensed private hire vehicles in Cheltenham.

It is reported that these vehicles are actively 'working' in Cheltenham, insofar as they are picking up customers in Cheltenham and are sat waiting in their vehicles for bookings to come through on the app.

Up until now there has been limited demand on the Uber app; however, this has inevitably changed. Whilst the availability of Uber vehicles in Cheltenham is undoubtably causing a pinch for hackney carriage drivers, and Cheltenham private hire operators, Uber drivers are not committing an offence by legally parking up anywhere within the borough and picking up passengers who have booked a journey through their app.

If a person in Cheltenham accesses the Uber app, the app can locate the nearest driver and allocate this booking to the relevant operator (that also licenses the driver and vehicle). As long as Uber drivers are not actively touting for business, usually by engaging in conversation and approaching customers, they are operating legally.

If you have concerns regarding out-of-town licensed drivers picking up customers in, or waiting on, any taxi rank, please can you refer these complaints to the local authority who has issued the vehicle licence. If you are in a position to supply photographic evidence, they can issue points or a strike to the driver concerned.
